Bennie J. Swans Jr. was a longtime community and civil rights activist and a former chair of the Horry County Democratic Party that passed away in September 2020. He was a veteran of the Vietnam War and a recipient of the Purple Heart for his service. Bennie was a driving force in the formation of the annual Martin Luther King Freedom Rally events and parade in Myrtle Beach each year. This was his way of uniting people across the county because of his belief in embracing diversity equity and inclusion. Bennie led with his heart, and you could often hear him say "Do Something" to make our community a better place.

- The essay will be evaluated on the applicant's relationships, impact & background towards an underrepresented or marginalized group.
- The applicant's commitment, involvement, and desire to improve the community.
- Quality of application: leadership question responses, letters of recommendation, grammar, punctuation, and spelling.
